### IS Leadership:

We wanted to let you know how much we love USL and are thrilled to be working together as the Co-Directors. Our roles have expanded from last year. We would like to share with you the way our partnership will work.

- Jody Lemmon will be your day-to-day contact on campus. She will greet your children at drop off between 7:20-7:40 under the awning and send them off to you at the end of each day at 2:55.
- Nan Kleiner is your point person for more substantive questions & longer discussions. She will be on campus from 8:00-12:00 each day and will continue her work for USL at home. She is available in the afternoons by phone/Zoom, and she can also coordinate in-person meetings with advance notice. She may reach out to you throughout the year from her cell phone. # **Communication:**

- You should email both of us. We meet together every morning and stay in close communication. We also get together regularly with the IS faculty to keep abreast of all the comings-and-goings of your students and review/plan each week.
- We'll send a comprehensive weekly learning plan email on a consistent schedule. It will tie together the use of the school-provided daily assignment planners/agendas by your student and our Moodle on-line school platform. All of this is to keep everyone informed and on the same page.
- The students will help produce a regular (weekly or every 2 weeks) newsletter with pictures and insights from their learning adventures.

## **Academic Enhancements**

We have created two enrichment classes.

I) Latin/Greek & Mythology will be taught by Frank Williams. Our MS/US Latin teacher since 2013, Mr. Williams will be coming down to the IS to share his expertise in Latin and Greek roots. He is a fantastic story teller and will share many wonderful Greek and Roman Mythology stories with your students. Historically, this program has resided in a smaller and different form in Humanities and L&L traditionally, and this is an expansion to help reading comprehension, vocabulary acquisition, Spanish (and other languages) learning, and more. And USL students overwhelmingly love mythology!

II) Our Middle & Upper School English teacher Sophia Shelton will join the IS students on Tuesday afternoons for enriching "read alouds" and other exciting reading and writing elements. She has experience as a CCPL youth librarian, and she'll be an asset in growing and supporting our culture of pleasure reading in our students.

Another new face on the IS team, but not to USL, is Mrs. Maria Pacas. She is one of our MS/US Spanish teachers. Pacas also has extensive experience with younger students. She guest taught the IS in the Spring and is looking forward to teaching your students full-time this year.
