

Opening for 2025-2026 School Year PT Elementary Teacher, primary focus is ELA PM position (approx. 16 hours/week = 4 hours/day, 11:00-2:55, 4 days per week - M, Tu, Th, Fri)

Located in Mount Pleasant and serving the metro Charleston area, University School of the Lowcountry (www.uslowcountry.org) (USL) is a co-educational, non-sectarian, non-profit independent school with tax-exempt 501(c)(3) status. Founded in 2007, USL is geared to high-achieving students and offers an invigorating environment for learning: it is filled with kind, hardworking, smart, thoughtful, and curious students. Our faculty are caring, capable, empowered, and respected by students, parents, and administration. Offering grades 3-12 and serving approximately 80 students, University School seeks to develop self-confident, passionate, and compassionate learners who will make a positive difference in the world.

Because of the growth of our school, we are seeking an innovative, energetic and positive Elementary School teacher. This is a perfect job for a teacher who has stepped away from full-time work and wishes to get engaged with a vibrant and positive school community.

The job entails collaborating with the two Co-Directors/Lead Teachers of the Intermediate School, overseeing the IS students, and primarily providing ELA instruction. The days are Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday – students go on field trips on Wednesday.

This position comes with the support of a team of other English and Humanities (History, English, and Art) teachers. There is also flexibility if desired. For example, the candidate can serve as lead teacher in all aspects -- planning and implementing instruction for high achieving students. Or the role can be tailored to fit the strengths of the candidate, and this can be adjusted over time if desired.

A degree in Elementary Education or English is preferred but not required. This would be a terrific position for someone looking to share their gifts for teaching in a respectful, grateful, and supportive community for a few hours a day and 4 days per week.

The English program is individualized for each student in many ways, allowing proficient students to thrive and advance and master material at an accelerated pace. It is also necessary that all foundational skills are learned and integrated fully. Support for the critical elements of English (reading, writing, etc.) are also supported through other faculty and their classes. This includes a Reading Enrichment, Humanities, Greek & Latin roots, Leadership & Life Skills (reading widely, expanding vocabulary, etc.), and more.

USL Intermediate School students also learn Math, Humanities, Mandarin, Spanish, Leadership and Life Skills, Science, Latin and Greek roots & Mythology, and Art. These courses are taught by other instructors. USL also features daily PE in the morning for all students, and our hallmark Learning Outside the Classroom program entails weekly field experiences (one day per week). We believe in learning by doing, and teachers are encouraged to venture with their students into the community and to bring speakers into the School. This includes all students in the IS taking a multi-day overnight trip each year.
